Business History Studies Network Bulletin No. 19 – December 2014

Summary

The **Business History Studies Network (REDHE, by its acronym in Spanish)** is pleased to be publishing this **nineteenth issue** of its virtual bulletin. Divided in six sections, the bulletin presents a thorough review of 2014 most important publications and events amongst the business history discipline in Latin America.

In the first section, **Debates**, the editors present a follow up of the discussion on gender and business history. In August, the [History, Business and Entrepreneurship Newsletter](#) (School of Management, Universidad de los Andes, Colombia) published a dossier on women in business history, opening the debate on gender issues in the discipline. Barbero and Lluch, show that only few studies in Latin America have focused on gender; therefore, the invitation to pursue a historical revision of women in business. In this number, two **books are reviewed**. Evangelina Tumini comments on a book about industrial policy, entrepreneurs, bureaucracy and Peronism (Belini, 2014). María Inés Barbero presents a study on the history of market research in Colombia (Ospina et. al., 2014)

Also in this issue, the section **Convocatorias y Reseñas de Congresos** shows a list of call for papers in 2015. In **Recursos**, there is an invitation to browse the Harvard website on new perspectives on course development in the Business History in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. There is also a call to use the international history statistics and the Digital Humanities Network.

The section **Tesis Doctorales**, presents the summaries of two thesis recently submitted by Alejandra Landaburu (PhD in Social Sciences, Universidad Nacional de Tucumán, “Los empresarios azucareros y la cuestión social. Tucumán, 1904-1930”) and José María Saccomanno (MSc in History, Universidad Torcuato Di Tella, “Los ganaderos argentinos y el frigorífico nacional”).

To close this bulletin, the section on archives for business history (**Archivos para la historia de empresas**) calls the attention over Pemex archive, a new available online source.
